Write a short paragraph that describes the context, the people involved, and what this connects to in Plato's "Allegory of the Cave." Try to connect your previous discussion in "Plato and Relativism" to this.

<u>Example</u>

People who won't support President Obama only because he's black, not necessarily because of any other disagreement with his politics or policies. These people live in a prison of prejudice. If they do become aware of their prejudice and change, then they often must face the painful realization of how they have hurt others, and they may also face disapproval from family and friends who still are prejudiced. Plato would say we must always do what is good, which he equates with morality. No matter what the consequences, we should always take the high road for this is the only path to spiritual and intellectual enlightenment.
